Meet Texas A&M University-Central Txas alumna, Carol Gould. She earned her degree in Business Administration in 2011 and later decided to pursue her childhood dream of teaching.

Gould has taught first graders, second graders, and now teaches fourth graders at Hay Branch Elementary School. Before her children were able to attend school, Gould worked as a licensed child care provider. Once her children were enrolled in school, she made sure to take any volunteering opportunity she could.



Over the years, Gould was frequently asked by some of her friends to help their children with assignments and homework. A defining life moment for her came when two of her friend's children struggled to pass their state assessment prior to graduation. Realizing the greatest challenge for the students was reading, she decided that she needed to be part of the education system. Specifically, she wanted to ensure students who struggled in reading were supported prior to attending High School.

COBA Students Volunteer with Tax Assistance Program VITA

During this p ast tax se ason, over 25 accounting students volunteered with United Way of Central Texas to prep are tax returns, free of charge for those who make \$55,000 or less. The prog ram

specifically helped persons with disabilities, the elderly, and limited English.

Each VITA volunteer took a 16-hour training course and became an IRS-certified volunteer to provide basic income tax return services to the community of Bell County. The team successful sub mitted over 300 returns with a 99% acceptance rate.
