



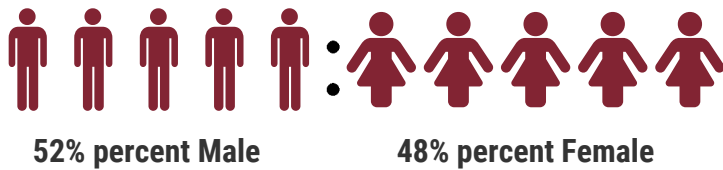

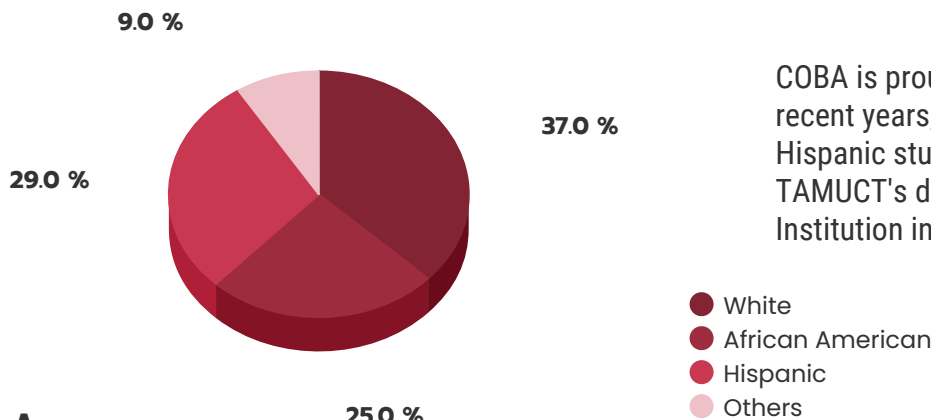
DIVERSITY

Gender



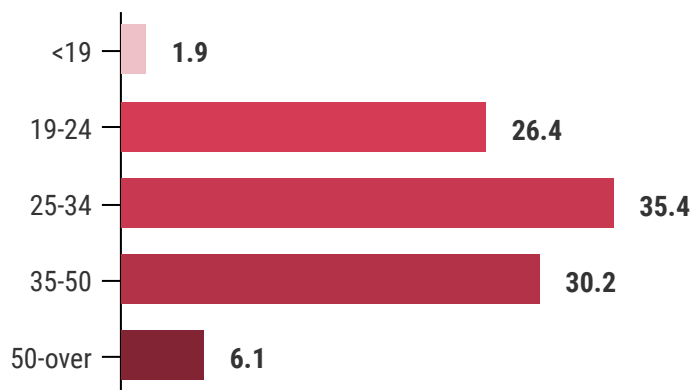

Ethnicity



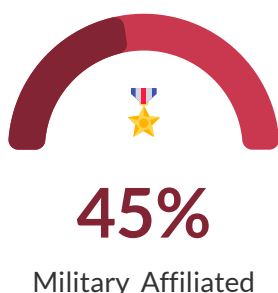

Age



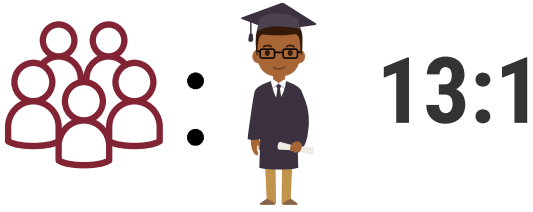
Many non-traditional, working students are attracted to TAMUCT's COBA programs. In 2020-2021, over two-thirds of all COBA students were above the age 25.

Military



COBA provides academic degrees to diverse student bodies including local military community. As of 2020-2021, 45% of COBA students were categorized as military affiliated (Active, Reserved, Spouse, and Children).

Student-Faculty Ratio



COBA offers a student-centered learning environment. As of 2020-2021, the student-faculty ratio was 13:1. Faculty support students in various career preparation, including career conversations in course-related contexts, and mentorship outside the classroom.

In AY 2021, 57 percent of COBA students who met the eligibility criteria received a federal Pell Grant.

Scholarships are offered in support of degree completion. Over the last three years, 125 of these scholarships were awarded.
