PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Expand career advancement opportunities in management, community/population health and research with the Registered Nurse (RN) to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program at Texas A&M University-Central Texas. This program provides a seamless pathway for students with an Associate Degree in Nursing to start the next chapter in your career. The BSN will provide a foundation for nurses to pursue graduate studies such as nurse practitioner, nurse educator, or nurse executive.

This flexible program is available fully Online and can be attended part-time or full-time for completion in as little as one calendar year.

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION

1. Complete the undergraduate transfer application at applytexas.org.
2. Pay the non-refundable application fee or attend a transfer day for an application fee voucher.
3. Submit final official transcript(s) from ALL college level institutions previously attended.

PROGRAM ADMISSION

1. Have a current unencumbered Texas Registered Nurse's (RN) license or of a Compact State, or be in the last semester of an associate degree program in nursing.
2. Have completed all or be within six (6) hours of completing non-nursing transfer courses required for the BSN degree.
3. Have earned a "C" or higher in all transfer courses applicable to the BSN degree.
4. Complete the Application to the Nursing Program.
5. Submit reference form.
