You are expected to provide thoughtful posts as a response to the discussion questions, and provide a minimum of two responses to the posts shared by other students. Failure to provide thoughtful comments/responses will result in losing points. It is your responsibility to do good research by reviewing articles and other materials to support your argument. You must cite all the resources you use.

Project: There will be a final project that is worth 35 points (35%). The details will be provided later in the class.
