### Course Overview and description

Explore the politics of environmental protection in America. Special emphasis on domestic environmental policy and the affects of federalism in shaping and implementing environmental policies.

### Course Objective and Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs)

1. Identify major environmental problems and articulate their causes and effects.
2. Differentiate between various policy proposals and critique benefits and drawbacks of each
3. Recognize how various actors and institutions impact the policy making process
4. Relate environmental policy to other major policy areas in order to prescribe comprehensive plans

### Grading Criteria Rubric and Conversion

- Discussion boards will open once a week on Canvas. They will typically be due by the end of the week (Friday). Late responses will be accepted for 3 days at half credit. Beyond that, no make ups will be allowed without documentation. Responses will be to particular questions related to readings or current events. Comments must be meaningful, useful, and most

importantly, respectful.

- The attendance score will be reduced by .5 percentage point for each unexcused absence.
- Exams will contain a mixture of question types such as short answer and multiple-choice questions, the final exam is cumulative.
- Expectations for the paper are provided below.

**Research Paper: 20% of final grade. Worth 100 pts**

- **5pts: Topic Approval**
- **10pts Bibliography**
- **15 pts Grammar and Formatting**
- **75 pts Content**

Each student will be responsible for completing one research paper of **5-7 pages**. Formatting guidelines are as follows: double-spaced lines, one-inch margins (i.e., top, bottom, left, and right), and Times New Roman font. A bibliography must be included and follow American Political Science Association Style for citations. Papers will be graded based on grammar, content, and clarity.

Topics must be approved by **Feb 24**. The final paper is due Fri **Apr 14**. Any papers turned in after this time will be considered late. Each day late will result in the loss a full letter grade.

Paper direction: identify ONE issue (carbon emissions, air quality, water safety, etc). Give a brief overview of how the issue is currently seen as an environmental problem. 2<sup>nd</sup>, give a detailed overview of legislation and regulations that have dealt with the issue as well as pending recommendations. Explain why efforts have succeeded or failed and consider the political and economic context of the issue.

**Posting of Grades**

Grades will be posted on Canvas within **7 days** of each assignment.

**Grading Policies**

Discussion Boards cannot be made up beyond the ability to complete them in Canvas unless approved by the instructor who may choose to allow for late submission or excuse the assignment. Other late work will be reduced one letter grade for each day late. No exam will be made up without an excused absence. Make up exams are scheduled at the instructor's convenience with a preference to use the testing center.

### **University Library & Archives**

The University Library & Archives provides many services in support of research across campus and at a distance. We offer over 350 electronic databases containing approximately 631,525 eBooks and 75,149 journals, in addition to the 97,443 items in our print collection, which can be mailed to students who live more than 50 miles from campus. Research guides for each subject taught at A&M-Central Texas are available through our website to help students navigate these resources. On campus, the library offers technology including cameras, laptops, microphones, webcams, and digital sound recorders.

Research assistance from a librarian is also available 24 hours a day through our online chat service, and at the reference desk when the library is open. Research sessions can be scheduled for more comprehensive assistance, and may take place virtually through WebEx, Microsoft Teams or in-person at the library. ### **University Writing Center**

University Writing Center: Located in Warrior Hall 416, the University Writing Center (UWC) at Texas A&M University–Central Texas (A&M–Central Texas) is a free service open to all A&M–Central Texas students. While tutors will not write, edit, or grade papers, they will assist students in developing more effective composing practices. In addition, students may work independently in the UWC by checking out a laptop that runs the Microsoft Office suite and connects to WIFI, or by consulting our resources on writing, including all of the relevant style guides. Whether you need help brainstorming ideas, organizing an essay, proofreading, understanding proper citation practices, or just want a quiet place to work, the UWC is here to help!
