Learn synthesis of theories of motivation with practical applications of motivating people, such as students or business employees. Examine historical and recent developments and their relationship to behavioral research, including concepts such as goals, work quality, work environment, and the use of rewards and other incentives.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Syllabus Quiz (100pt/ 10%)

The first Module has a syllabus quiz. Please take the quiz to get familiar with the course content. If you say to yourself that it is only worth 10% of my grade, it won't matter. They may not be true; the syllabus quiz is only open for the first two weeks of class. Students have lost a chance for an A because they did not participate in the assignment or, even worse, failed because they needed those few extra points to pass the class. You can take the quiz up to three times. My goal is for you guys to have these points and know how and where to find assignments.

Discussion Board Assignments- (350pts/35%)

Students will post a motivational video, quote, or information about a book on motivational concepts that they are reading to discuss with their peers each week. A few of the Db maybe student lead, so be creative in coming up with a post that will inspire other students to comment on your submission.

Rubric and Conversion

Discussion Board and Post rubric

5 points	Grammar, spelling, sentence structure (you're in college, write like it)
10 points	Covers the week's topic thoroughly (i.e., defined well, examples provided, etc.)
10 points	Respectful engagement with another post, not just agree, but support your argument or viewpoints with research.

Readiness Assessment Tests (RAT) (400pts/40%)

Weekly short 10 question or less. The quizzes may include material from previous chapters all of the quizzes are multiple choice with maybe an essay at the end of a few of the quizzes.

Storytime Application Project (100pts/10%)

This project is designed for students to use their personal stories to apply the content from the course. For this grade, you will

- 1. Choose a motivational theory. Please watch the Video of Dr. Clark explaining how to join a top group.
- 2. Write your story down in a short essay (3–5-page body, add a cover and references page to the body), including specific applications from the text that lines the theory with your personal story using APA style 5th edition when citing the sources on the motivational theory you choose. Then upload your essay to Canvas. This part of the assignment is worth up to 100 points

Video Presentation (50pts/5%)

• 3. Present your story by making a video presentation of your story (worth up to 50 points); please be as creative as you would like to be in presenting your story. There will be instructions on how to load your story to Canvas. Also, there will be instructions on how to make a video if you do not know how to.
