COURSE INFORMATION

Course Overview and description

Class instruction in the fundamentals of keyboard technique for beginning piano students.

Course Objective or Goal

The objective of this course is to develop practical and essential skills used at the keyboard. These skills and outcomes include:

- a strong foundation in and overall confident musicianship including performance of repertoire, sight-reading, harmonization, transposition;
- technical proficiency at the piano, including scales, arpeggios, triads and cadences;
- critical listening skills and ability to speak about music in a mature and articulate manner; and ensemble playing and collaborative piano skills.

Student Learning Outcomes

- 1. Produce five finger patterns in major and minor keys.
- 2. Play major and minor scales in selected keys.
- 3. Construct and play chords of different qualities.
- 4. Harmonize a melody.
- 5. Perform selected compositions.

Practice
