COURSE INFORMATION

Course Overview and description

(WI) This course is designed to develop advanced strategies to identify readiness for learning; and to understand when and how to adjust content, process, or product in order to differentiate responsive instruction effectively. This course should be taken in the second block of the teacher education program. Certification Fee - \$150. Prerequisite(s): Completion of teacher education block 1 with a minimum 2.75 GPA.

Course Overview: Topics include the effective instructional strategies, including use of feedback, grouping techniques, and other effective instructional strategies.

Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs)

The learner will be able to:

1. use a range of instructional strategies, appropriate to the content area, to make subject matter accessible to all students.
2. differentiate instruction, aligning methods and techniques to diverse student needs, including acceleration, remediation, and implementation of individual education plans.
3. adjust content delivery in response to student progress through the use of developmentally appropriate strategies that maximize student engagement.
4. actively anticipate, and adapt instruction to address common misunderstandings and preconceptions.
5. design instruction, change strategies, and differentiate teaching practices to improve student learning based on assessment outcomes.
6. explore current developments, new content, new approaches, and changing methods of instructional delivery within their discipline.
7. become conversant with basic assumptions, concepts, and principles of major learning theories.
8. distinguish key concepts, models, and strategies related to different theories of learning.

WI Course (Writing Instructive Course)

Writing Instructive courses vary across programs, just as writing adopts diverse forms and functions across different disciplines. In a WI course, writing facilitates learning; as such, a number of written assignments have been incorporated to allow students to learn both the subject matter of the course and discipline-specific ways of reasoning and writing.

WI Course Requirements

- This course has a range of writing assignments worth a significant part of the final grade.
- Writing assignments are an integral part of measuring the mastery of the content in a course.
- All written assignments are tied to specific course objectives and outcomes.
- You will receive feedback on submitted writing assignments.
- You will be required to revise two assignments (Theorist Paper and Reflection) to improve your understanding of what it means to be a reflective practitioner and to gain deep understanding of educational theories/theorists.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. *3-2-1 Journal Prompt*. 6@ 5 pts each (30 pts): Using information presented in the text, students will respond to a 3-2-1 journal prompt for weeks 2-7. See Canvas for rubric.
2. *Discussion Post*. 2 @ 10 pts each (20 pts): Students will view two videos that utilize best practices in instructional strategies for their grade band. Then, using information in Canvas write a detailed summary of what strategies were used, student responses, and future implementations. See Canvas for rubric.
3. *Strategy Assignment*: (25 pts): Students will create instructional strategies for both direct (Madeline Hunter) and indirect (5E) lesson plans across the grade band. See Canvas for rubric.
4. *Reflection*: (30 pts): Students will write a reflection on their observations in K-12 schools (20 pts). You will be given a prompt in Canvas to respond to. Rubric will be provided. This reflection will be revised (10 pts) after feedback from the professor.
5. *240 Tutoring*: (10 pts): Students will complete the diagnostic exams in their cert area. Upload the report into Canvas. Students then take their Content Representative Test on assigned day.
6. *Theorist Project*: (100 pts total) Students will explore theories and theorists that relate to effective instruction, models of teaching and instructional strategies and develop a chart of key components. See Canvas for rubric. (20 points). Based on information from the theories, students will select who they most align to and create a graphic organizer that depicts the theories and personal views. See Canvas for rubric. (20 points). Students will then write a paper that includes details from their Chart and Graphic Organizer. Students will have an opportunity to revise their paper and will receive feedback during the writing process. See canvas for rubric. (20 points). Finally, students will create a voice-over presentation that includes information from their Chart, Graphic Organizer, Paper and a conclusion about how the learning theories have impacted K-12 education across the years. See Canvas for rubric. (40 pts).

Grading Criteria Rubric and Conversion

Grades will be assigned at the end of the semester on the following basis:

F = 59-0%

All assignments are due on Sunday at 11:59 as assigned for that week. Grades will be posted on the Canvas Grade book where students can monitor their status. Turn-around time for grades to be posted are within 2 weeks. Larger projects may take more time. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to email me or come by my office.

Grading Policies

All assignments must be submitted on time to receive full credit. Any late assignment submitted will have an automatic 25% deduction or not accepted per the instructor's decision. Note: Arrangements in exceptional circumstances (hospitalization, catastrophe, etc.) are the responsibility of the student. This means you must meet with the instructor to discuss the situation and provide documentation. If you are having technology difficulties, email the assignment to yourself and print in the library. Research guides for each subject taught at A&M-Central Texas are available through our website to help students navigate these resources. On campus, the library offers technology including cameras, laptops, microphones, webcams, and digital sound recorders.

Research assistance from a librarian is also available 24 hours a day through our online chat service, and at the reference desk when the library is open. Research sessions can be scheduled for more comprehensive assistance, and may take place virtually through WebEx, Microsoft Teams or in-person at the library.
