Course Development:

GB 311: Continuously improved the course from traditional lecture / text book assignments to using interactive software that allows students multiple opportunities to reinforce learning. Using the technological pedagogy, developed a completely online course, where students view recorded lectures and then use the software to complete assignments. Current pedagogy includes the use of statistical software to assist in analyzing data. Course met all required standards for Quality Matters peer review in Summer 2012.

GB 512: Developed the course from a graduate level foundations course to an applied statistical analysis course. Currently use MINITAB statistical software and actual data to conduct analyses. Developed the course into a completely online course, where students view recorded lectures and then analyze data while answering assignment questions in Blackboard.

GB 585: Developed the course for a future program in project management. The course follows the guidelines and objectives established by the Project Management Institute. Fall 2015 is the first section taught, review and improvement of the course will occur prior to the Spring 2016 offering.
