## **Teaching Innovation and Curriculum Development**

Revise Existing Course. BUSI 5310 Business Research Methods. January 2019 - Present.

Redesigned the course to better support multiple teaching modes (e.g. F2F, Online, and Blended).

Additionally, redesigned courses assignments to better align the course outcomes with the program outcomes (i.e. MBA). Fall 2019 marked the implementation of the new designs in the online and blended sections.

Revise Existing Course. BUSI 3311 Business Statistics. August 2008 - Present.

Continuously improved the course from traditional lecture / text book assignments to using interactive software that allows students multiple opportunities to reinforce learning. Using the technological pedagogy, developed a completely online course, where students view recorded lectures and then use the software to complete assignments. Current pedagogy includes the use of statistical software to assist in analyzing data. Course met all required standards for Quality Matters peer review in Summer 2012.

New Course. MGMT 4370 Introduction to Project Management. August 2016 - May 2018.

Developed the course for a future program in project management, at the undergraduate level. The course follows the guidelines and objectives established by the Project Management Institute. Fall 2017 was the first section taught, and became a permanent course beginning in Fall 2018.
