I also conduct forensic evaluations in various other WNC counties, and for private individuals.

**October 2010 to July 2011:** *Offender Services Clinician, Meridian Behavioral Health Services, Sylva, NC.* I conducted comprehensive offender evaluations and provided offender treatment services for sex offenders and domestic violence offenders in seven rural NC counties. Treatment included individual and group therapy and as well as DV case management with court system and collaborative treatment providers.

**May 2010 to January 2011:** *Licensed In-Home Therapist at Family Preservation Services, Asheville, NC:* I headed a team of professionals providing therapy services to at-risk children and adolescents and their families and

conducted multiple comprehensive clinical evaluations.

**June 2007 to May 2010: *Psychological Services Specialist; Department of Corrections, Commonwealth of PA at SCI Huntingdon, PA*** (maximum security prison). I provided crisis intervention therapy, brief therapy, group therapy (Dual Diagnosis, Batterers Intervention, and various specialized therapy groups), parole evaluations, administration of psychological assessments, pre-release evaluations, outside clearance evaluations, and diagnostic assessment referrals for psychiatric services.

**December 2005 to June 2007: *Specialized Evaluator/Postdoctoral Internship in Psychology at Philhaven Behavioral Health, Mt. Gretna, PA***. My postdoctoral internship consisted of conducting clinical psychological evaluations and writing psychological reports for Behavioral Health Rehabilitative Services (BHRS State of PA). Additionally, I served as an outpatient therapist in the Harrisburg office of Philhaven, serving all ages of patients with various mental health disorders, from a multitude of socioeconomic backgrounds.

**June 2003 to December 2005: *Outpatient Therapist and Predoctoral Psychology Intern at Philhaven Behavioral Health, Harrisburg PA***. I served as a general outpatient therapist for multitude of DSM IV disabilities, all ages. I conducted intakes, designed treatment plans, wrote daily progress notes, and coordinated services with insurance companies and psychiatrists. I used play therapy, CBT, DBT, Multimodal Therapy, EMDR, Reality Therapy, Guided Imagery, Mindfulness, and several other therapy interventions. I conducted variety of psychological assessments using standardized instruments and inventories. I facilitated the Philhaven Day Hospital for serious emotional and behavioral disabilities such as Dissociative Disorder, Schizophrenia, Major Depressive Disorder, Bipolar Disorder, drug and alcohol issues, eating disorders, Obsessive-Compulsive Disorders, PTSD, and Anxiety Disorder. I was the primary group leader for an after-care program, a weekly group for patients in transition from hospital to outpatient therapy. I also appeared in Court on several occasions for custody evaluations and juvenile issues and consulted with numerous physicians on medical treatment for patients. I referred several patients to the hospital for suicidal/homicidal ideation. I coordinated treatment with children's school counselors, psychologists and teachers.

**October 2004 to May 2010: *Part-time Geriatric Psychotherapist for Allied Behavioral Clinicians, Mechanicsburg, PA***. I conducted therapy sessions with geriatric residents of various nursing homes. I used informal assessments and therapeutic strategies to assess level of functioning, and help residents develop coping strategies for such psychological problems as depression, anxiety, mood disorders, and dementia. I also assisted with mental health treatment planning for nursing staff.

**June 2003 to August 2003: *Psychology Intern at the State Correctional Institution at Camp Hill, PA*** (a medium-security prison). I assisted with individuals in crisis situations and conducted interviews for parole evaluations and outside clearance readiness. I co-facilitated groups on depression, domestic violence, anger management and goal planning. I attended weekly medical evaluation meetings with team of psychiatrists, psychologists and counselors. I focused on treating sex offenders, mentally ill and special needs inmates.
